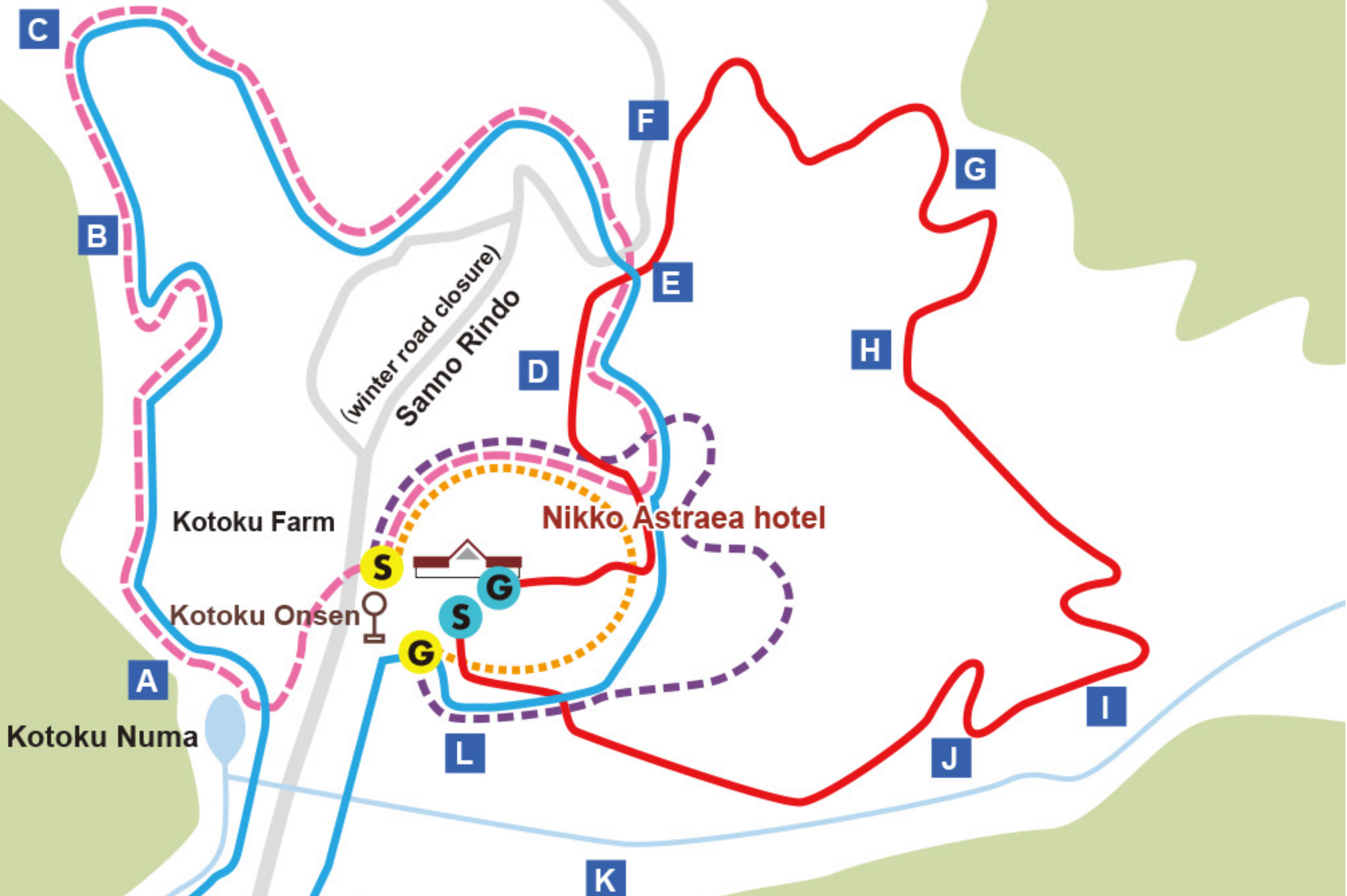

Explanation of each point

A Kotoku-numa is a swamp formed by several branches of the Gyakkawa River and is recommended for rest and nature observation. Waterfowl such as kogara and mallard ducks can be observed, as well as river fish such as the aburaha ya-ya.

B The stream in this area is a sheer cliff about 8 to 15 meters high.

C The Gakushuin University lodge and other buildings are landmarks.

D A small, deep valley suddenly appears. This is the most difficult point on the course.

E Gentle downhill curves continue. In the thickets, kookaburras and red-cockaded woodpeckers are abundant.

F Monument to Yajima Mitsutaka Yajima's Poetry
On the right side of the course, there is a monument to introduce Mitsutaka Yajima, who was popularly known as "Nikko no Yama no Kami-sama" ("God of the mountains in Nikko").
"The white birch is bleached when the moon comes at night."

G In many places, curves lead to steep downhill slopes.

H The area is lined with giant mountain cherry trees, fir trees, beautiful barked bamboo birch trees, and Japanese elm trees. Sliding slowly and tree-watching is also interesting.

I The valley below the Brahma Falls can be seen.
After this curve, the trail becomes a downhill course.

J This is a slightly hard area that continues to climb for a while. Use busking, open-leg climbing, and stair climbing flexibly.

K Erosion control dam buried in snow.

L Behind the tennis court, in the early morning, flocks of mahiwa and red-breasted nuthatches can be seen pecking at the berries.

M This area is also a great snowfield for practicing snowshoeing.

N The surface of the Gyakagawa River is not always visible due to icy and snowy conditions, and if you go down to the riverbank and slip, you may end up in the river! It could happen....
Be sure to stay on the course.
